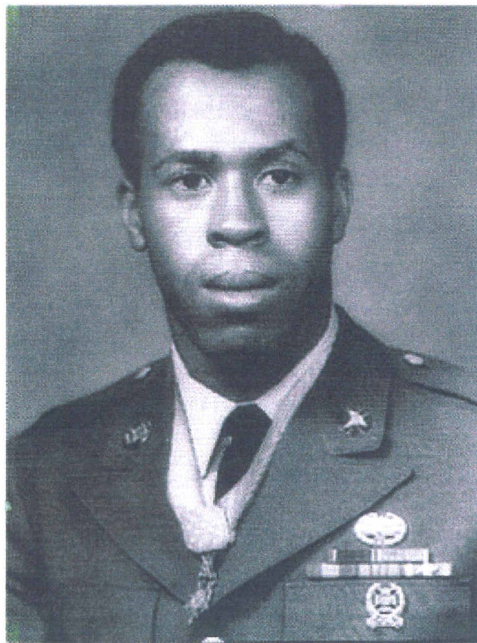


Funding for the Wall of Honor's estimated \$500,000 construction cost is expected to come from grants as well as corporate and individual donations.

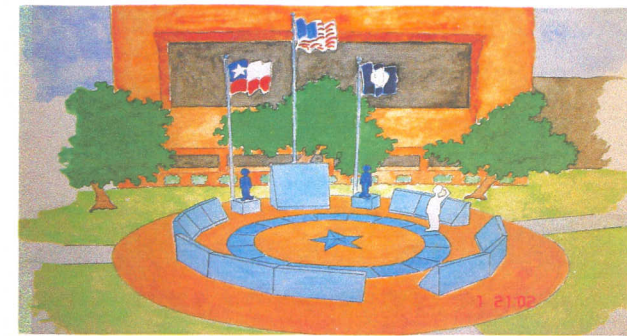

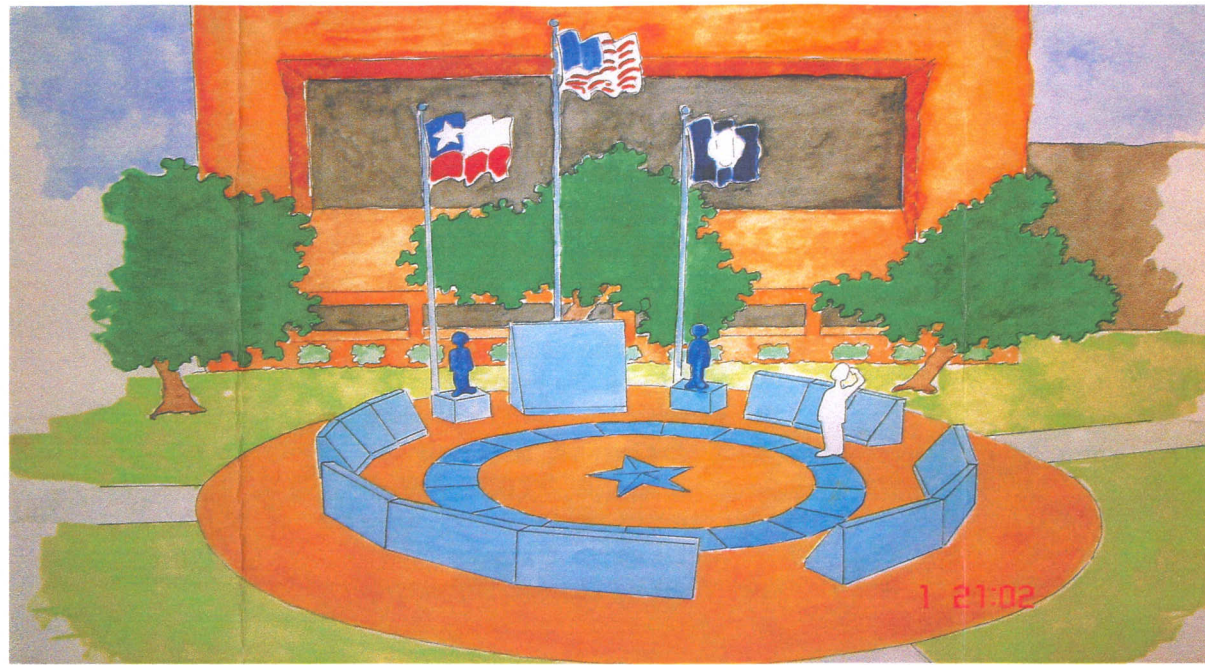
## Brazoria County Wall of Honor

*Anticipated completion date  
Memorial Day 2009*

**Brazoria County  
Courthouse Grounds  
Angleton, Texas**



Located on the northwest corner of the Brazoria County Courthouse grounds and available for public viewing 24 hours a days, 365 days a year, the focal point of this unique circular memorial will be a six foot tall six foot wide black granite stone dedi-



cated to the military heroes of Brazoria County.

Proudly surrounding the dedication stone will be the United States flag, the State of Texas flag along with the flag honoring our Prisoners of War.

On either side of the dedication stone will be two life-size bronze statues resting on black granite pedestals. One of the statues will be Brazoria County's only Medal of Honor recipient Clarence Sasser depicting his heroism during the Vietnam Conflict. The other

statue will be of a Gold Star mother reflecting on the folded memorial flag she has just received and realizing the true meaning of ultimate sacrifice.

In the center of the 40 foot circle will be a three dimensional granite star circled by sixteen bands of 24 inch wide black granite tiles laser etched with photo reproductions of battle scenes.

Twelve 3 foot tall black granite monuments will encircle the star and etched tile panels.

Six of these monuments will represent the six branches of the United States military - the Army, the Navy, the Air Force, the Marines, the Coast Guard and the Merchant Marines.

The remaining six monuments will

be inscribed with the names of the military men and women of Brazoria County who have died honorably in service to their country during World War I, World War II, the Korean Conflict, the Vietnam Conflict, the Gulf War and the War on Terrorism.

Those names listed on the current Wall of Honor located inside the Brazoria County Courthouse will be transferred to the new Wall of Honor and the current Wall of Honor will be officially retired.
